



OCN LONDON QUALIFICATIONS IN HEALTH AND SOCIAL CARE

OCNLR Level 1 Award in Preparing to Work in Adult Social Care

Preparation for employment or progression to higher level qualifications in the adult social care sector.

Credit Value: 6/GLH: 53. Eligible for funding at 16-19 and 19 plus.

OCNLR Level 1 Award and Certificate in Introduction to Health, Social Care and Children's and Young People's Settings

Preparation for working with children and young people for employment or progression.

Award: *Credit Value: 10/GLH: 86.*

Certificate: *Credit Value: 25/GLH: 213.*

Eligible for funding at 16-19 and 19 plus.

OCNLR Level 1 Award and Certificate in Skills for Professions in Health and Social Care

Gives learners the opportunity to gain a solid grounding in health and social care in order to progress. The Certificate can easily be incorporated into a 14-19 study programme. In addition we offer **FREE** schemes of work, learning materials and assessment materials.

Award: *Credit Value: 9/GLH: 75. Eligible for funding from January 2018.*

Certificate: *Credit Value: 32/GLH: 270. Eligible for funding at 16-19 and 19 plus.*

OCNLR Level 1 and 2 Awards in Awareness of Mental Health and Wellbeing **NEW**

Aimed to provide all people, not involved with the delivery of mental health services, with an understanding of mental health and its issues. **FREE** learning resources available.

Level 1 Award: *Credit Value: 1/GLH: 8.*

Level 2 Award: *Credit Value: 2/GLH: 16.*

Eligible for funding from January 2018.

OCNLR Level 2 Award in Promoting Employment in Social Care

Aimed at Care Ambassadors. Designed to help them provide information to others about career opportunities in social care.

Credit Value: 6/GLH: 48. Eligible for funding at 19 plus.

OCNLR Level 2 Award in Emotional Resilience **NEW**

Supports self-awareness and skill development for learners in FE, staff and volunteers in hospices, care homes and other health and social care facilities. A sample workbook is also available.

Credit Value: 6/GLH: 48. Eligible for funding at 16-19 and 19 plus.



The demand for qualified and committed people to work in health and social care has never been higher. This sector offers plenty of opportunities for suitably qualified people to develop stimulating and rewarding careers.

OCN London has developed a range of national qualifications for the health and social care sector. They are designed for people who may want to progress on to higher level qualifications or into employment.

One of the specific attractions of these qualifications is their flexibility. Learners can choose from a selection of units to make up a study programme that reflects their particular interests.

OCNLR Level 2 Award in Supporting Activity Provision in Social Care

Aimed at support workers in social care. Designed to highlight the beneficial impact of activity on physical and mental well-being.

Credit Value: 8/**GLH:** 62. *Eligible for funding at 16-19 and 19 plus.*

OCNLR Level 2 Award in Assessing Daily Living Equipment for People with Disabilities

Enables community staff to develop the knowledge, understanding and practical skills required to be proficient in the assessment, use and fitting of basic daily living equipment for people with disabilities.

Credit Value: 2/**GLH:** 14. *Eligible for funding at 19 plus.*

OCNLR Level 2 and 3 Awards in Awareness of Dementia

Seeks to develop knowledge and understanding of dementia for people involved in caring for those with dementia.

L2 Award: **Credit Value:** 8/**GLH:** 72.

L3 Award: **Credit Value:** 11/**GLH:** 86.

Level 2 Award eligible for funding at 16-19 and 19 plus.

OCNLR Level 2 Diploma in Skills for Further Study in Health and Human Sciences

Focuses on the transferable skills and knowledge learners need to progress on to higher level vocational qualifications including Access to HE Diplomas.

Credit Value: 39/**GLH:** 309. *Eligible for funding at 16-19 and 19 plus.*

OCNLR Level 3 Certificate in Bridging Skills for HE

Developed with Skills for Health. Aimed at people who need to gain academic skills in order to enter higher education to become registered nurses or other professional healthcare roles. Electronic assessment guides are available for **FREE**. Attracts 8 UCAS Tariff Points.

Credit Value: 16/**GLH:** 112. *Eligible for Advanced Learner Loans.*

OCNLR Level 3 Certificate in Activity Provision in Social Care

Designed for care workers. Seeks to increase understanding of the important role of coordinated activity provision in person-centred care.

Credit Value: 18/**GLH:** 119.

Eligible for funding at ages 16-19.

Eligible for Advanced Learner Loans.

OCNLR Level 3 Certificate in Tackling Substance Misuse

Aimed mainly at volunteers or practitioners working in the field of substance misuse.

Credit Value: 15/**GLH:** 105. *Eligible for Advanced Learner Loans.*

OCNLR Level 5 Award in Palliative Care Awareness **NEW**

Provides continuing professional development for healthcare professionals who manage, or wish to manage, palliative care for individuals in healthcare settings.

Credit Value: 8/**GLH:** 12.



What is the difference between Awards, Certificates and Diplomas?

There are three sizes of qualifications in the Regulated Qualification Framework (RQF) – Awards, Certificates and Diplomas. Each one is made up of a number of credits with notional hours of study, called guided learning hours. An Award has the lowest number of credits and the least hours of study. The Diploma has the highest.
